(Dear Darents / Carers

Last Friday the staff of St John's had a day of *faith* formation. It was a wonderful opportunity for prayer, contemplation and nurturing our spirituality. The day (organised by Mrs Bawden) took the staff on a pilgrimage in this Jubilee Year of Mercy. We went on a journey to a sacred place - St Mary's Cathedral; passed through the door of Mercy; prayed; listened to the 'Word of God'; shared Eucharist and had the opportunity to encounter Christ's mercy. Pope Francis reminded us in this Year of Mercy that "the mercy of God is a beautiful truth of faith for our lives. God's love for us is so great, so deep, it is an unfailing love; one which always takes us by the hand and supports us, lifts us up and leads us on." As followers of Christ we should find these words very comforting. Last Sunday was the final day of the Jubilee Year of Mercy. As Pope Francis closed the Holy Door in Rome the universal church gave thanks to God for His abundant mercy towards all of creation. And church leaders renewed their commitment to be people of mercy in imitation of our Saviour for the years to come. Mrs Bawden represented St John's school at the Parramatta Diocesan Ceremony of the 'closing of the door,' at St Patrick's Cathedral. Mrs Bawden accepted a commemorative gift on behalf of our school community. The religious poster will be hung in the school as a reminder that all people in our school community should strive to be people of compassion and mercy.



<u>The last term</u> in every school is very busy. This term for example at St John's we have had or will have: an intensive swimming program, Early Stage 1 transition days and parent information night, curriculum evening, school disco, OLMC work experience students program, WH&S audit, Annual School Report, end-of-year mass and pageant, Year 6 fun day, Year 6 graduation and supper, school picnic, parent / career volunteer liturgy and morning tea, report writing and the professional learning that the staff is involved in throughout the term. I am mentioning this to point out that while all of this is going on, so is excellent teaching and learning in each of the learning spaces.

As the year draws to a close, I want to remind you all that the teaching learning goes on right to the end of the term. We will continue to have literacy support and numeracy support, as well as all of the other key learning areas. Improving the learning outcomes for all our children at St John's is our core business. The children's learning is our first priority. My appreciation and thanks to our parents / carers for your valuable role as the primary educators of your child for supporting the staff in this most important and satisfying work. We are blessed to have a dedicated team of professionals at St John's who give so generously of their self, skills and time. As well as learning, our high expectation of good behaviour and attention to the uniform policy also continue. The summer uniform is to be worn with black shoes. Regulation hair accessories and jewellery are also to be worn. I ask for your support in this area please.

Our Christmas pageant is on Friday 2nd December and is one of the highlights of the year. This year Andrew Chinn, a renowned musician and composer, will lead the Christmas pageant. He will rehearse with the children throughout the day in preparation for the evening. Remembering the real meaning of Christmas is always the focus of this event as well as a showcase of our children's talents. I am aware that this is a very busy time of year for everyone and some students may have

other commitments elsewhere. If this is the case please send in a note to inform your child's teacher. It is our wish that all our students are able to attend St John's Christmas concert.



It was a lovely experience to welcome next year's <u>kindergarten</u> <u>children</u> to St. John's as part of the transition program. We look forward to learning more about these delightful children over the next few weeks and working in partnership with their families in the years ahead.

It was a privilege to witness some of our students take the next step in their faith development at *Confirmation* on Tuesday 15th November. It was a memorable ceremony officiated by Bishop Vincent. assisted bv Father Zac. Congratulations to our students and families. Our appreciation and thanks to Mrs Cathy Downey, St John the Evangelist Parish Sacramental Coordinator, Mrs Janelle Bawden, Religious Education Coordinator and teachers: Miss Espiritu, Mrs McCarter, Miss Saliba and Mrs Tolhurst who helped prepare the children for the reception of the Sacrament.

Over the last few weeks the teachers have been working hard in preparing <u>student reports</u> for the second semester. The end of year report will be sent home on Friday 2^{nd} December.

The information contained in the report is a summary of your child's achievement and is one of a number of ways we communicate with you about your child's development, achievement and progress. Teachers use a grade scale (A to E) to report on the level of achievement. The grades are determined by measuring student performance against stage outcomes reached at the point in time of the reporting period. The grade your child receives will reflect their level of achievement based on the outcomes and the content covered so far this year. The grade scale summarises how well students achieve at each grade by describing the depth of knowledge and understanding and the range of skills that students working at that standard typically demonstrate.

Making progress is best understood by the following explanation: If your child receives the same grade on two consecutive reports they have made progress. For example if they receive a 'C' in English in the middle of the year and again at the end of the year they have made progress. Between the two reporting periods the student will have learned new knowledge and skills of a more advanced nature. To receive a grade 'C' on the second occasion the student must have a sound knowledge and understanding of the main areas of content and has achieved an adequate level of competence in the processes and skills in relation to this new and more challenging material.

Please take the opportunity to ask your child's teacher if you have any questions about the report or grading.

In keeping with our reporting policy optional parent teacher interviews are available starting Monday 5th December. If you require an interview please contact your child's teacher who will schedule a time with you.

Our School leaders, Jeremiah Krillic, Natasha Bracken and Jessica Couzins represented St John's at the Riverstone RSL <u>Remembrance Day</u> <u>Service</u>. The children laid a wreath at the Cenotaph on behalf of the St John's Community. The children were wonderful ambassadors for St John's. Well done!

The Riverstone Combined Churches <u>Christmas</u> <u>carols</u> is on again this year. Please consider allowing your children to be part of this community event. They do not have to be in the choir – it is open for the whole school to sing the songs we are learning with Mrs Heslop. A separate note will be sent home outlining the details.

The <u>Parent's and Friends Association commit-</u> tee <u>meeting</u> will take place on Monday 28th November. This will be the last for the year. I encourage you to come along and show support for the P & F and for St. John's. It would be wonderful to see some new faces and hear all your fantastic ideas.

The meeting starts at 7.00pm and concludes at 8.30 pm. Looking forward to seeing you there.

Just a reminder that a fundraising group meeting will be held this evening at 7.00pm in the hall. This meeting is for any interested community members (parents, carers, teachers, parishioners) who would like to contribute to a forum to discuss the possibility of holding a major fundraiser for St John's in 2017.

<u>The school disco</u> was a great success; and was well-attended. It was a tremendous night of dancing, music and fun for both children and parents. It was heart warming to hear the many positive comments from our community. Events like these help nurture friendships and build community spirit. 
Each page of the syllabus has a section called Language. This shows the language that is taught in that strand. The words that are in bold are new words to that stage.







All volunteers will need to complete the **Undertaking for Volunteers' Form and Training Module** online before they can volunteer at St John's, please use the link below.

Step 1: Complete 'Building Child Safe Communities - Undertaking for Volunteers' Form

You will need to complete a Volunteers Form for **each location** that you volunteer. A notification of your successful completion of the form will be sent via e-mail to the volunteering location and also to your email address.

Step 2: Complete the online training module

It is a system requirement that the online training module be completed by all volunteers commencing at any of our locations and the training needs to be completed every second year.

- Open the module by clicking the **Start** link below.
- Read through the presentation.

Complete and submit quiz questions (this will take approximately 10 minutes).

NOTE: IF YOU HAVE ALREADY COMPLETED THE TRAINING MODULE YOU WILL ONLY NEED TO COMPLETE THE 'UNDERTAKING FOR VOLUNTEERS' FORM.

- NAIL POLISH is NOT PERMITTED
- SCHOOL HAT IS TO BE WORN OUTDOORS AT ALL TIMES (St John's Primary School has a NO HAT NO PLAY Policy)
- GIRLS AND BOYS ARE REQUIRED TO WEAR TIES WITH THE WINTER SCHOOL UNIFORM
