(Dear Darents / Carers

I am sharing the following Gospel passage with the staff at our weekly prayer. You will hear this passage at Mass on Sunday. I encourage you to contemplate the Gospel reflection below:

Gospel Mt 17:1-9 A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew *His face was shining like the sun.*

Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone. There in their presence he was transfigured: his face shone like the sun and his clothes became as white as the light. Suddenly Moses and <u>Elijah</u> appeared to them; they were talking with him. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. 'Lord,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here; if you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses and one for <u>Elijah</u>.' He was still speaking when suddenly a bright cloud covered them with shadow, and from the cloud there came a voice which said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; he enjoys my favour. Listen to him.' When they heard this, the disciples fell on their faces, overcome with fear. But Jesus came up and touched them. 'Stand up,' he said 'do not be afraid.' And when they raised their eyes they saw no one but only Jesus. As they came down from the mountain Jesus gave them this order, 'Tell no one about the vision until the Son of Man has risen from the dead.'

Gospel Reflection

Jesus takes his most trusted disciples up a high mountain to allow them to share in what he knows is about to occur. It is a very clear teaching moment in which Jesus hopes the disciples are going to finally grasp the truth about him. As the disciples stand by, Jesus is transformed before them – suddenly bathed in light and his clothes become dazzlingly white. The disciples also see Moses and Elijah standing and talking with Jesus. Moses was the great Law-giver of Jewish tradition and Elijah the great prophet. Together, they represent the Law and the Prophets – the combined wisdom that make up the tradition of Jewish teaching and Jewish scripture. It is the Law and the Prophets that Jesus' life and ministry brings to fulfilment. It is fitting that Moses and Elijah appear beside Jesus, as the three figures combined represent the fullness of Jewish tradition – the Law of Moses; the challenge and promise of the Prophets; and the compassion of Jesus that completes the other two. Sadly, the disciples don't really get the point of what they see before them. Peter, caught up in the moment, wants to build tents on the spot to mark the moment and to continue to dwell in the moment. Jesus, however, leads them back down the mountain – back into the valley; back into the reality of life; back into the tragedy that he knows lies before them. No matter how powerful a religious experience may be, Jesus shows us that we always have to return to real life. It is not possible to remain on the 'mountaintop' as Peter would have liked to do;

We have to take the experience back into the everyday of our lives.

Sunday's Gospel gives more than a hint as to what we believe. This was no out-ofbody experience of religious ecstasy. This was an utterly bodily experience. Jesus' body was translucent, totally radiant with Divine Light. **<u>Curriculum Overviews</u>** were sent home last week. Parents / Carers are reminded to use the overview to discuss their child/s learning with them.

On Monday we **welcomed Mrs Kim Roffmann** to our school community. Mrs Roffmann comes with a wealth of experience and will be a great asset, both as part of the Stage 3 teaching / learning team and in her leadership role as Religious Education Coordinator. I'm confident that you will join with us in welcoming Mrs Roffmann into our community. I would like to take this opportunity to thank Miss Espiritu for taking up the role of Liturgy Coordinator in the absence of a REC. Miss Espiritu did a fantastic job in coordinating liturgies; supporting the parish sacramental team and addressing other RE matters. I have appreciated Miss Espiritu's leadership in this role and her commitment to Religious Education at St John's.

St John's Parent Information Evening on 'Growth Mindset' was a great success. Mr Fisher's presentation was informative and engaging and provided parents with a number of strategies that they can use at home in developing positive attitudes to learning and in building confidence, persistence and resilience in their children. Thank you to the parents / carers who were able to attend this event. Mr Fisher, Mrs Izci and Mrs Roffmann will be attending a **Project Based Learning <u>Course</u>** this week (Wednesday – Friday) to support them in designing a project that will engage Stage 3 in learning experiences at a deeper level. Project Based Learning is a teaching method in which students gain knowledge and skills by working for an extended period of time to investigate and respond to an authentic, engaging and complex guestion, problem, or challenge. In the 21st century workplaces; secondary schooling and in colleges, success requires more than basic knowledge and skills. In a **project**, students learn how to take initiative and responsibility, build their confidence, solve problems, work in teams, communicate ideas, and manage themselves more effectively. PBL helps address educational standards.

On Sunday the <u>Stage 2 and Stage 3 students celebrated a very special Mass</u> <u>with the parish.</u> I would like to thank the students for their reverent participation in the liturgy. During this Mass a number of our students enrolled in the Parish Sacramental Program to prepare for the reception of First Holy Communion, <u>Jacob Camilleri</u>, <u>Jallara Spence</u>, <u>Jessica Spryn</u>, <u>Chanelle</u> <u>Jerri</u>. We ask you to keep these children in your prayers. Thank you to Mr Shields, Mrs Izci, Mrs Stafford and

Mrs Roffmann for supporting the children at this Mass. Your generosity in time is very much appreciated.

Last week our senior students participated in the diocesan **netball gala day**. Two teams (girls senior team and a boy's senior team), 22 children in total represented our school. The students enjoyed the competition against other schools in our diocese.



As we draw closer to our **school fete** we need to consider the ways in which we can support the school community group. Stage 3 have started **growing the herbs** for the plant stall. Children are encouraged to continue to bring in items for the Tombola stall. Thank you for your support of the **gold coin pyjama day** last Thursday. The proceeds of this event provided funds to the SCG for the fete. This event raised \$155.50. Teachers and students are beginning to make plans for their art piece for the auction at the fete. Tips for Parents to Improve a Child's Writing Skills.

Writing is an essential skill. It is more than just putting words on paper. Writing is a process of communication that plays an important role in your child's life—both in and out of the classroom. Parents can make a big difference in helping a child develop



writing skills by encouraging writing activities that are simple and fun.

The following are some examples of activities parents can do with their child to promote writing at home:

• **Send a Message** - Frequently leave notes on pillows, desks, mirrors, wherever. Have your child write you a note in return. A family chalkboard or message board is a great tool for encouraging your child to write messages.

• *Letters* - Make letter writing a habit for your child. Have your child write letters to family and friends.

• *"Year in Review" Scrapbook* - Keep an ongoing record of your family's life. Every family member can add to your family's story. Include important events that happen during the year. To add to your story, include family photos, brochures and ticket stubs of family outings and events.

• **Postcards** - Have your child write and mail postcards on family vacations or special outings.

• **Say "Thank You"** - Let your child get in the habit of writing "Thank You" notes for gifts or whenever it is appropriate to do so.

Make a Menu - Let your child design and write the menu for a family dinner. This is a great activity that will keep a child busy while mom or dad is cooking.
 Travel log - When you go on trips or special outings, have your child record new sights and experiences from his/her journey.

Remember that the important thing for parents to focus on is the content more than grammar and other details of his/her child's writing. *When a child begins to write, he/ she runs the risk of receiving criticism—parents have the job of encouraging their*



child to continue. Writing is a skill and habit. Helping your child put thoughts into words gives him/her a great sense of accomplishment. Fostering good writing habits and showing an interest in your child's writing will make a big difference in their attitude

towards writing.


