(Dear Darents / Carers

Today we celebrated **Ash Wednesday**. During our liturgy black crosses were marked on our foreheads to signifying the start of the Lenten Season. Ash Wednesday derives its name from the practice of the distribution of ashes upon the forehead's of Christians.

The ashes are meant to remind Christians about human mortality, while also showing the individual's desire for repentance and spiritual cleansing. As the priest or minister puts the ash on the body he, or she, says "Remember that thou art dust, and to dust thou shalt return" (Genesis 3:19) or "Repent, and believe the Gospel" (Mark 1:15).

At school the students will be learning more about Lenten practices and how as Christians what they are asked to do during this season. As we know Lent is the season of Christian preparation for the celebration of Easter and is a time of spiritual growth. The focus is not to be on one's self, but one's relationship with God. During Lent many Christians / Catholics uphold the church traditions of fasting, acts of charity and alms giving. *Today we should give some thought to what we will do this Lenten season to deepen our relationship with God.*



Catholic Schools Week

Change to After School Dismissal

To ensure an orderly dismissal of students at the end of the school day we have made changes to our dismissal procedures. Please note the following: Class teachers will accompany their students to the blue area in front of the hall at 2.50pm; Students will assemble in class groups facing the under croft;

All parents are asked to wait in the under croft area. Parents are asked NOT to gather near the ES1 room or the Stage 1 room;

The teacher on parent pick up duty will dismiss students (from the blue area) when parents arrive to pick up their child / children;

Once parents / carers have collected their children they are asked to move away from the under croft area. Students must then remain with parent / carer; Children going to after school care will assemble in a separate line to be collected by an OOSH staff member; Children going home by bus will be supervised by the teacher on bus duty.

EMERGENCY CONTACT DETAILS

Over the Counter Medication

Over the counter medication including analgesics or homeopathic preparations cannot be administered by school staff unless a written request (Request to Administer Medication Form) is received from the student's parent/ carers and is accompanied by written advice from a medical practitioner with the medication in the original labelled container. The exception is reliever puffers for the emergency treatment of asthma.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR ALL PARENTS/CARERS THE GATE NEAR THE KISS AND DROP AREA WILL BE CLOSED BY THE TEACHER ON DUTY AT THE CONCLUSION OF KISS AND DROP DAILY

IF YOU ARRIVE AFTER THE BELL AT 8.50am YOU WILL NEED TO USE THE INTERCOM TO GAIN ENTRY AND MUST ACCOMPANY YOUR CHILD TO THE OFFICE TO COMPLETE A LATE ARRIVAL/ PARTIAL ABSENCE FORM, YOUR CHILD WILL BE GIVEN A LATE ARRIVAL PASS TO HAND TO THEIR CLASS TEACHER TO CONFIRM THAT A PARTIAL ABSENCE HAS BEEN

Step 1: Complete 'Building Child Safe Communities - Undertaking for Volunteers' Form

You will need to complete a Volunteers Form for **each location** that you volunteer. A notification of your successful completion of the form will be sent via e-mail to the volunteering location and also to your email address.

Step 2: Complete the online training module

It is a system requirement that the online training module be completed by all volunteers commencing at any of our locations and the training needs to be completed every second year.

- Read through the presentation.

Complete and submit quiz questions (this will take approximately 10 minutes).

THIS IMPORTANT INFORMATION IS REQUIRED URGENTLY AND NEEDS TO BE RETURNED TO THE SCHOOL OFFICE If your child is absent from school it is the Parent/Carers responsibility to send to school with the child (on their return) a written explanation of the reason for absence and it also needs to be signed by the Parent/Carer. This is a legal requirement.
