# **First Semester Report**

As you meet next week with your child's teacher to discuss the report it is important to keep the focus on the child. Our first priority at St John's is our children. We aim to develop each child according to their ability. For our school to do its job effectively, the ongoing support and interest of the parent / carer is vital. Teachers and parents working together in partnership means common goals can be established and developed more effectively and efficiently. It is important for children to see parents and teachers supporting each other. To ensure that our meeting time runs according to plan we ask that you allow ample time to arrive at school for your interview. If you haven't booked an interview time please do so today so that you don't miss out on the opportunity to meet in partnership with your child's teacher to celebrate successes and discuss strategies to further support your child.

# The A - E Report

As you would be aware the reports are mandated by the Government for all grades except kindergarten who have a different style. The achievement level / common grade scale is provided by the Board of Studies. The overall achievement level is for the whole Key Learning Area (KLA) which may contain many strands. It is important to note that some strands have more weight than others. The overall achievement is not just a straight averaging of strands.

Each year of schooling introduces different concepts, content, units of work and skills which can increase in difficulty from the year before. It is therefore possible that your child's achievement level in a particular KLA may change. It is important that parents / carers have an understanding of the reporting system and achievement levels. For example, the achievement level of a 'C' is awarded to children who have achieved sound knowledge and understanding of work covered in that particular grade at the particular time. It means your child is working and achieving appropriately for their stage.

Our parent teacher interviews aim to explain, elaborate and support the reports. If you have any questions in regards to the achievement levels please seek clarification during the interview.
