

Dear Parents/Carers,

Each student will receive their End of Year School Report for 2020 on Wednesday 9th December. Our End of Year reports will revert back to our traditional E-A report that will be familiar to you. If you have any questions about your child's learning please contact your child's teacher who can organise a teleconference before the end of the year.

The Grade Scale

This scale was developed to outline a common set of standards that teachers are required to use to report on your child's level of achievement. The grades are determined by measuring student performance on material covered up to the point in time of the reporting period.

The grade your child receives will reflect their level of achievement based on the material covered this year. The grade scale summarises **how well** students achieve at each grade by describing the depth of knowledge and understanding and the range of skills that students working at that standard typically demonstrate.

The reports are based on expected student achievement for their **academic year level** not their **learning stage**.

The Grade Scale is represented in the table below.

Grade or Word		Grade Descriptions
A	Outstanding	The student has an extensive knowledge and understanding of the content and can readily apply this knowledge. In addition, the student has achieved a very high level of competence in the processes and skills and can apply these skills to new situations.
B	High	The student has a thorough knowledge and understanding of the content and a high level of competence in the processes and skills. In addition, the student is able to apply this knowledge and these skills to most situations.
C	Sound	The student has a sound knowledge and understanding of the main areas of content and has achieved an adequate level of competence in the processes and skills.
D	Basic	The student has a basic knowledge and understanding of the content and has achieved a limited level of competence in the processes and skills.
E	Limited	The student has an elementary knowledge and understanding in few areas of the content and has achieved very limited competence in some of the processes and skills.



Allocating Grades

Teachers gather and analyse a range of data sets when considering overall grading in each key learning area on the written formal report. The data is obtained from: assessment tasks administered in class, daily learning experiences, guided learning experiences, anecdotal observations, differentiations (adjustments) in relation to specific learning needs of students (in other words, overall classwork) in determining each child's placement on the E-A scale. In years one to six the number of students in each stage achieving an A to E grading is indicated in the key learning area sections on the report.

As we are not permitted to have gatherings on site we are unable to hold a Kindergarten Orientation night or conduct school tours. We have developed a COVID safe plan to welcome our new children into our community.

In Term One our Dance Fever Program was suspended due to COVID. Consequently, the instructors were not able to implement the ten week program. Two more lessons were needed to finish the program. Last Friday the Dance Fever instructors were onsite to deliver another lesson. We are negotiating a date for the final lesson which is owing to us. The lesson on Friday was delivered outdoors on the blue area in front of the hall. Students remained in their respective stages throughout the lesson. The children really enjoyed this lesson and were thoroughly engaged throughout. I think this was attributed to the 'dance off' between stages where individual students were able to 'show off' their dancing skills to lead their stage in competing against another stage. It was quite entertaining.


