FEELING UNWELL, GET TESTED AND STAY AT HOME

There appears to be some confusion about the protocols and procedures regarding student attendance at school when they are unwell and COVID-19 testing requirements. The COVID update forwarded to parents / carers on the 19th August from the Executive Director, Greg Whitby still stands; it has not changed. I refer our community to the following excerpt from Mr Whitby's letter:

COVID-19 Testing

- Currently, no student should attend school if they are unwell. That still
 applies but now, each student who is absent from school or who has been
 sent home because they have flu-like symptoms <u>must have a COVID-19</u>
 test
- Students are not able to return to school <u>until they return a negative</u>

 <u>COVID-19 result and are symptom free</u>
- A negative COVID-19 test result must be provided to the school before a student can come back to school. The test results can be a NSW Health or COVID-19 Testing Centre letter, SMS or email and/or a medical certificate.
 - These same protocols apply to school staff

Managing COVID-19 is a complex issue. At St John's (as elsewhere) our primary goal is the well-being of our students, families and staff. With this in mind we will continue to implement practices and protocols advocated by NSW Health and the Catholic Education Department. When there is a change to advice from Health professionals and the CEDP we will inform our community immediately. Thank you for your continued support in this matter.

Talking and Listening Skills

Talking and listening are important life skills that are part of the NSW school curriculum. The Department of Education has the following advice for parents:

Being able to take in information, respond to instructions and share ideas, thoughts and opinions are all vital skills your child will need.

Thankfully it's an area where teachers are experts, but there are ways you can help your child develop these skills and reinforce talking and listening at home.



Talking and listening tips

- 1. Avoid interrupting your child when they're talking and listen carefully to what they have to say.
- 2. Use everyday opportunities to talk with and listen to your child as they share things that are of interest or importance to them.
- 3. Show your child you are interested in what they are saying when they are speaking by giving nods, smiles, sounds, supportive words and gestures. The positive feedback helps reinforce to them that what they say is important and worthwhile.
- 4. If your child has trouble remembering things said to them, it's a good idea to encourage them to repeat in their mind what has been said, then retell it in their own words. Making notes can help if they have to do a task.
- 5. If you are planning something such as a special occasion or purchasing a gift, try having a brainstorming session with your child. You can do this just by listening and sharing ideas or by writing them down together.
- 6. Discuss common dates on a family calendar, such as public holidays, and have your child mark in important events.
- 7. From the calendar, talk about days, months and years in relation to events such as birthdays and other special occasions.
- 8. When walking or travelling together, talk about street names and the meaning of signs, etc. You could discuss anything known about names and signs encountered (eg give an explanation about how street names may have come about).

STAGE THREE

STAGE 3 INCURSION

Normally, this term, Stage 3 would have gone on an overnight excursion and visited Parliament House and the Museum of Democracy but due to Covid 19 restrictions, this was not able to take place. We still wanted Stage 3 to have an experience of Parliament so with this in mind, we booked a virtual incursion.

On Friday, Stage 3 participated in this virtual incursion entitled "the Parliamentary Process'. The students broadened their knowledge on democracy. They also developed an understanding of how a preferential vote is undertaken and participated in a preferential vote. There were 5 candidates chosen, each representing a party - these were the 'No Homework Party, the Sports Party, the Digital party, the Lolly Party and the Pets party. The students had to have their name marked off a roll like they would at a polling booth, they were then guided on how to undertake a preferential vote and then votes were counted and totalled by chosen students, then a process was undertaken with the students showing them how the preferential system works until there was a party that had a majority vote. The students also learnt about the 3 levels of Government and what each level of Government is responsible for. They also broadened their knowledge on the Senate and the House of Representatives. On the day the students also participated in a role play depicting the House of Representatives where they had 2 sides of government and debated the issue of 'No homework'.


