Next Sunday 13 December is the third Sunday of Advent. The 3rd Sunday of Advent symbolises Joy with the "Shepherd's Candle" reminding us of the Joy the world experienced at the coming birth of Jesus. This week the pink candle is lit on our advent wreath. A reading from the holy Gospel according to John Jn 16:8 19-23

There stands among you, unknown to you, the one who is coming after me.



A man came, sent by God.

His name was John.

He came as a witness,

as a witness to speak for the light,

so that everyone might believe through him.

He was not the light,

only a witness to speak for the light.

This is how John appeared as a witness. When the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, 'Who are you?' he not only declared, but he declared quite openly, 'I am not the Christ.' 'Well then,' they asked, 'are you Elijah?' 'I am not,' he said. 'Are you the Prophet?' He answered, 'No.' So they said to him, 'Who are you? We must take back an answer to those who sent us. What have you to say about yourself?' So John said, 'I am, as Isaiah prophesied: a voice that cries in the wilderness: Make a straight way for the Lord.'

Now these men had been sent by the Pharisees, and they put this further question to him, 'Why are you baptising if you are not the Christ, and not Elijah, and not the prophet?' John replied, 'I baptise with water; but there stands among you – unknown to you – the one who is coming after me; and I am not fit to undo his sandal-strap.' This happened at Bethany, on the far side of the Jordan, where John was baptising.

#### The Gospel of the Lord

Let us take the time to reflect on this Gospel and look at how we are preparing ourselves for the birth of Jesus. Are our hearts open to receive this great gift and in turn share this great gift with others.

I would like to take this opportunity to wish everyone a safe and blessed Christmas time with family and loved ones. Covid has taught us this one lesson that family time and spending time with loved ones is so important. Let us take the time to be really present to each other at this special time.


