Dear Parents/Carers,

MAI and Best Start Assessments

Thank you to our parents and carers for bringing your children to school for either **MAI** testing (Year 1 – 6) or **Best Start** testing (Kindergarten). The data that teachers gather from these assessments are invaluable. It allows the teachers to identify the individual learning needs of each student and to develop learning programs and tasks that personalise the learning. The testing period will continue over the next few weeks until all beginning of year data is collected.

Curriculum Overviews will be sent home by the beginning of week 3. This overview will give you an outline of the teaching and learning planned for your child this term. I encourage you to read the overview carefully and display it in a prominent position to refer to throughout the term. The overview can be used as a platform to engage your children in discussion about their learning this term. If you need clarification about any aspect of the overview or if you have any questions about your child's learning please don't hesitate to contact your child's teacher.

A student 'Code of Conduct' was sent home last week which outlines the expectations the school has for your children. I ask that parents / carers read through this document with their children and talk to them about their commitment to St John's code of conduct. Please sign the Code of Conduct before returning it to your child's teacher.

Building project

I am pleased to announce that the building project for the new administration office is underway. The work was commenced on the 6th January 2020. It is anticipated that the project will be completed in the first few weeks of Term 2. Due to the building work there have been some changes to routines this term to ensure the safety of our students; The Stage 2 children are now placing bags in the under croft area prior to commencement of school each day and for safety reasons the entire 'fenced off' area of the administration block is out of bounds for all community members.

Coronavirus

What is the current advice to parents? NSW Health is urging parents of children who have had contact with a confirmed case of coronavirus to keep their children at home and not send them to school or preschool for 14 days, and to monitor for symptoms. All other children can attend school as per normal. You can find NSW Health's 'Advice for parents ahead of school returning' here. Commonwealth and state government agencies, including the Australian Department of Health, have established mechanisms to respond to matters such as this. We continue to monitor the situation and will provide you with updated information when that is made available.

Bush Fires

Over the school holidays, many parts of the country have been seriously affected by bush fires. Tragically, lives have been lost and more than 2,000 homes destroyed. The fires have also seen the significant loss of wildlife. While no CEDP schools were damaged, the impact of the fires continues to be felt in our school communities. With the start of the new school year, please be mindful that for many students, their families and staff, the events of the past few months will have had an emotional toll. With this in mind, the CEDP has asked schools to organise fundraising events across the diocese.

Fundraising

Week 4 of Term 1 2020 (17 to 21 February) has been nominated by CEDP as a week where schools can focus on fundraising activities to support victims of the bush fires, where capacity exists to do so.

Schools have been encouraged to be creative about their fundraising efforts. St John's has already reached out to St Ignatius in Bourke and many in our communities have given generously to various appeals. We are now proceeding to organise another fundraiser to take place in Week 4.

Safety

Students and Parents/Carers walking home in the afternoon will now leave via the back gate exiting on McCulloch Street. Parents/Carers are asked to please be vigilant while using the carpark especially in the afternoon. Please exercise patience and courtesy to others, parents please ensure you are holding your child/children's hands at all times. The safety of everyone is paramount.


Driving near buses Bus lights flash on the front and back of a bus when the bus is picking up or setting down school children. A 40km/h speed limit applies when bus lights flash. The speed limit is for all traffic travelling in the same direction as the bus, whether the bus is stationary or moving. Informal school bus stops Informal bus stops are not sign posted and are usually found in rural areas. They may be at the front of a property or on the side of the road. Drivers may find it difficult to see children at informal bus stops. Families should take special care when using these stops. Staying on the bus a bit longer to travel to another bus stop may reduce the need for your child to have to cross the road. Thank you to all parents and caregivers for bringing your children to school in Week 1 for either MAI testing (Year 1 - 6) or Best Start testing (Kindergarten). Your support is much appreciated by the staff. The MAI is an interview by the class teacher about the students understanding of mathematical concepts. This Mathematics assessment is designed to provide the teachers with detailed information about student's number knowledge and to assist in identifying the learning needs of individual students. The students answer questions in the domains of counting, place value, addition and subtraction, multiplication and division. The assessment results are reviewed and the data gathered is used to plan learning experiences for the students. When planning for lessons teachers use this information about what the students need to know and how students learn to plan engaging tasks.

There are four key beliefs about how students learn Mathematics

- 1. Children construct mathematical ideas from their experiences
- 2. Children learn through being actively and intensively engaged in mathematical learning experiences
 - 3. Children construct mathematical ideas through discussing, listening, simulating and reflecting upon their mathematical experiences and
 - 4. Mathematical learning involves taking risks and this requires confidence!



What if my child has to be away from school?

If your child has to be absent from school, you must advise the school and provide a reason for your child's absence. To explain an absence parents and carers may: • send a note or email the school • telephone the school, or

- visit the school and complete an absent form at the office.
- A small number of absences may be justified if your child:
- has to attend a special religious ceremony is required to attend to a serious and/or urgent family situation (e.g. a funeral) • is too sick to go to school or has an infectious illness

Children need to arrive to school and class on time

Lateness to school or leaving early from school must be recorded as a partial absence.

SAFETY TIPS

- Always drop-off at the designated drop-off zone and follow the schools procedures.
- Drivers must remain in their vehicles at all times.
- Make sure all children exit the vehicle from the drivers side passenger door only, (door closest to the teacher on duty).
- No student should be walking behind or in-front of their vehicle.
