COVID-19 (Coronavirus) Update

The Australian Government announced new advice as part of its response to the spread of COVID-19 (coronavirus). The new advice is:

- that 'non-essential' events with more than 500 people should not take place
 - avoid overseas travel unless it is essential
- Those arriving in Australia from overseas are required to self- isolate for two weeks

Other than where there is a case of COVID-19 confirmed, schools remain open.

The Executive Director of Education, Greg Whitby is continually providing all Catholic schools in the diocese of Parramatta with information about CEDP's response to COVID-19 (coronavirus). At this point in time all schools have been directed to take specific actions.



Actions being implemented at St John's

- School activities that would bring members of the public and family members to the school will be discontinued until further notice (e.g. parent-teacher conferences, Open Days / Nights, school tours
 - All offsite Professional Learning activities for staff are cancelled until further notice
 - ANZAC Day march cancelled
 - St John's advertised School Community Group meeting scheduled for 26th March has been postponed to further notice
 - Teachers and CEDP teacher educators will develop learning resources for home use

A parent information guide will also be developed to support student learning at home (if needed)

- Social distancing is being encouraged, this includes avoiding handshakes, hugs and other forms of incidental social contact. Students will not have contact with other students during the Dance Fever Program (hand holding during partner dances)
 - All major sports activities and events are temporarily ceased
 - All school excursions will be cancelled until further notice, including overnight excursions
 - Snack Shack will be closed until further notice, however lunch orders will be taken
 - School uniform shop will be closed until further notice
 - School assembly cancelled until further notice
 - Wherever possible technology will be used for communication Skoolbag, Facebook, digital newsletter
 - Holy Week celebrations for students and staff only
 - Regular and rigorous washing of hands with soap is being encouraged
- Safe and healthy practices around sneezing, blowing of the nose and disposal of tissues has been reinforced
 - Safe practice posters have been installed in classrooms
 - Soap products and paper towels available in all learning spaces

Parents and carers are asked to keep your child at home if they are unwell or show signs of being unwell. The health and safety of our community is our priority.

The CEDP has advised that further information will be provided to schools as it becomes available.

Helping Your Child with Mental Maths Calculations

Mental calculations that we carry out each day, we do in our heads. With some calculations we may use pen and paper or a calculator on our phones.

When we watch sport we carry out mental calculations on our heads. How many more points are needed to win ? Does our team have enough time left to score the winning points ?

Travelling, sharing a bill, shopping, playing sport or games all involve mental calculations.

So how do children do mental calculations?

Children begin by counting things they can see, and using objects to add and subtract. Through practice children begin to think of ways to add and subtract without having to use objects. One of the early ways in which children learn to add two numbers mentally is to start with the larger number and count on by ones to add the second number. As children begin to deal with larger numbers, they develop a range of ways other than counting by ones.

For example, to find the answer to 25 + 89, children could :

- Make the 89 up to 90, then add 10 and then 14
- Add 20 and 80 to make 100, then add 9 and 5, then add 100 and 14
- Add 10 twice to 89 then add 5 more.

One of the interesting things about mental calculations is that we do not all think the same way.

The NSW Mathematics curriculum contains working mathematically outcomes for each stage of learning. As part of these outcomes children learn about using a range of mental strategies when calculating as well as explaining how they worked out their answers to problems.

What can you do at home?

- Ask your child how he or she mentally worked out the answer to a question.
- Ask your child to work out how much change he or she will get when paying for an item at the shops.
- Encourage your child to estimate the cost of two items when shopping.

When playing games with two dice ,replace dot dice with ones that have numbers on them.

A small number of absences may be justified if your child:

has to attend a special religious ceremony • is required to attend to a serious and/or urgent family situation (e.g. a funeral) • is too sick to go to school or has an infectious illness

Children need to arrive to school and class on time

Lateness to school or leaving early from school must be recorded as a partial absence.

KISS AND DROP SAFETY TIPS

- Always drop-off at the designated drop-off zone and follow the schools procedures.
- Drivers must remain in their vehicles at all times.
- Make sure all children exit the vehicle from the drivers side passenger door only, (door closest to the teacher on duty).
- No student should be walking behind or in-front of their vehicle.
