Dear Parents/Carers,

This week marks Reconciliation Australia. National **Reconciliation Week** (NRW) is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures, and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving **reconciliation** in **Australia**.

Reconciliation Australia's theme for 2021 is, More than a word. Reconciliation takes action.

Reconciliation is a journey for all Australians – as individuals, families, communities, organisations and importantly as a nation. At the heart of this journey are relationships between the broader Australian community and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

We all have a role to play when it comes to reconciliation, and in playing our part we collectively build relationships and communities that value Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, histories, cultures, and futures.

2021 marks twenty years of Reconciliation Australia and almost three decades of Australia's formal reconciliation process.

On Thursday the children and staff will participate in a prayer service to recognise this significant week and in class will explore Indigenous story and artwork.

God of all creation, as we journey together in this Great Southern Land, we pray for healing, forgiveness and unity, creating a path of good will, with justice and compassion.

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SCHOOL DROP OFF AND PICK UP

The following changes will come into effect on Monday 24th May 2021

There are two options to enter the school in the morning for all students A to Z.

- 1) Via Kiss and Drop- refer to procedure below
- **2) Front gate (Gate 1)** for students walking to school or being dropped off by their parents not using the kiss and drop zone. These parents / carers must park their vehicle in McCulloch Street or nearby roads and walk the child to the front gate McCulloch Street (gate 1). Parents / carers are no longer permitted to park in the parish carpark to walk their child/ren over to the school entrance.

Kiss and Drop procedure

- Parents / carers must remain in their car when dropping children off using the designated drop-off lane in the parish carpark. This lane will be created using bollards.
- Children sitting in the back seat when being dropped off must alight from the driver side rear door.
- Parents / carers must remain in their vehicle.
- Parents / carers must always drive with caution when on site.
- Parents / carers using kiss and drop must enter the site via the McCulloch Street entrance and exit the site via the Garfield Road exit.
- Children's school bags should be in the car for easy access. Students are not permitted to go to the boot of a vehicle to remove a school bag.
- Parents/carers and children must not enter the school site on foot at the McCulloch Street driveway or the Garfield Road entrance and walk through the parish carpark to the top gate. **This practice is unsafe.**

At this stage there isn't any changes to afternoon dismissal; it remains the same, A-K Parish Carpark (Gate 3), L-Z Front Gate McCulloch Street (Gate 1). However, parents / carers are reminded to use the family name sign that was distributed last term. If you have misplaced your name sign, please contact the school office for a new one.

Any students that arrive late will need to be dropped off at the pedestrian gate on McCulloch Street (Gate 1) and be signed in by their parent/carer (A partial absence will be recorded)
