

Season of Advent

The First Sunday of Advent was on 28 November 2021. The season of Advent is a time of preparation and waiting for the birth of our saviour Jesus Christ. The symbols of advent are the advent wreath and candles.

The wreath is Circular - meaning without beginning or end. It symbolises God's complete and unending love for us—a love that sent his Son into the world to redeem us from the curse of sin. It also represents eternal life which becomes ours through faith in Jesus Christ.

The Green of the Wreath symbolises Our hope of newness, renewal and eternal life.

The Advent Wreath traditionally holds four candles (3 purple, 1 pink and 1 white) which are lit, one at a time, on each of the four Sundays of the Advent season. Each candle represents 1,000 years. Added together, the four candles symbolize the 4,000 years that humanity waited for the world's Savior—from Adam and Eve to Jesus, whose birth was foretold in the Old Testament.

The Light from the Candles symbolises the Light of God that came into the world through Christ to bring newness, life and hope.

The first Candle that is lit is the prophets candle - purple in colour. This candle symbolises Hope reminding us that Jesus is coming.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'There will be signs in the sun and moon and stars; on earth nations in agony, bewildered by the clamour of the ocean and its waves; men dying of fear as they await what menaces the world, for the powers of heaven will be shaken. And then they will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory. When these things begin to take place, stand erect, hold your heads high, because your liberation is near at hand.

'Watch yourselves, or your hearts will be coarsened with debauchery and drunkenness and the cares of life, and that day will be sprung on you suddenly, like a trap. For it will come down on every living man on the face of the earth. Stay awake, praying at all times for the strength to survive all that is going to happen, and to stand with confidence before the Son of Man.'


Sacrament of Confirmation

DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP OF STUDENTS

Kiss and Drop-Morning

All parents and carers are required to use the 'kiss and drop' zone which is set up in the parish carpark for morning drop-off (A-Z FAMILIES)

For those parents/carers who prefer to walk their child/children to school or park in McCulloch or Wood Street and walk with their child/children you are required to bring the child/children to the front gate. This gate will be left open for students to enter.

Parents/Carers are reminded students are only to enter the school site. Parents are not permitted to congregate in front of or near the school

Student Pick-up - Afternoon (Parish Carpark) (L - Z families only)

- 1. Parents / carers are to park their vehicle in the parish carpark and proceed to the collection area by foot holding their family name tag. This area will be marked out with coloured witches' hats.
- 2. Teachers on duty will call for your child to move to the exit gate to meet their parent / carer. This gate is situated nearer the church. Your family name card must be displayed.
- 3. Once your child/children have been collected parents/carers are to return to their vehicle and exit the carpark immediately.

Please be advised that parents / carers are not permitted to congregate in the carpark and must maintain social distancing. It is strongly recommended that parents/carers wear masks as all our parents may not be fully vaccinated at this time.

Student Pick-up – Afternoon (Front Gate) (A – K families only)

- 1. Parents / carers are to park their vehicle in Woods Street and enter through the front gate.

 Parents / carers do not need to use the QR code on entry.
- 2. Parents / carers are to assemble in the staff carpark in the designated area to collect their child/children. Your family name card must be displayed.

Please note that parents / carers must not congregate at the front of the school and physical distancing must be maintained. It is strongly recommended that parents/carers wear masks as all our parents may not be fully vaccinated at this time.
