### A Message from the Assistant Principal

Welcome back to 2022. It has been fantastic to see the smiling faces of the children as they arrived at school last week.

I have heard many parents and carers ask their children "what did you do today ?" after school.

Some children have an enthusiastic and long response while other students shrug their shoulders and find it hard to talk about their day. Talking and listening are important life long skills for children that take time and practice. The website <a href="https://raisingchildren.net.au/">https://raisingchildren.net.au/</a> offers the following helpful tips to support parents/carers talking with their child about school.

### Strategies for talking about school with your child

'How was school?' is a big question. To answer, your child has to sum up a whole day, and that's hard for children (and even adults!) to do.

You can just let your child know that you're glad to see them, and talk about non-school topics for a while. Younger children will probably also like unpacking their bags and going through any notes before you ask about school.

Every afternoon or evening will be different. Even if your child usually likes to share their day with you, there'll be days when they don't want to talk. Sometimes it's a matter of sensing your child's mood and picking the right moment. Some days there might not be a right moment at all, and that's OK.

Simple, positive and specific questions about parts of the day can get your child talking. It's good to use questions that invite more than a 'yes', 'no' or 'OK' response.

For example:

- What's the news from school today?
- What was fun?
- What did you like best at school today?
- What does your classroom look like at the moment?
- What did you do in class after recess?
- Who did you sit next to at lunchtime today?
- What subjects did you do today?



Talking with your child about the school day shows you're interested in what's going on in their life. This interest boosts your child's mental health, happiness and wellbeing. It can also have a very positive effect on your child's behaviour and achievement. It shows your child that you value school and education, which encourages them to value it too.

And talking about school issues – like school projects or friendship problems – is also a great chance for you to express your family values about things like teamwork, respect for self and others, friendships, relationships, problem-solving and so on. If your child is having problems at school , you are encouraged to contact their teacher.

When you're in touch with your child's feelings about school, you're more likely to see problems before they get too big. This way the school staff, children and parents/carers can work on overcoming challenges together.

### A Message from the Leader of Learning

#### **Beginning Year Assessments**

At the start of each year students undertake a number of beginning year Assessments including the **MAI** (*Mathematics* **Assessment Interview**) in Years 1-6 and the **Best Start Assessment** in ES1.

These assessments are one on one interviews between the class teacher and each child and provide teachers with a valuable opportunity to get to know the children in their class and collect important data.

The data collected provides insight into what the students know and areas that they find challenging so that the teaching and learning can be tailored to the needs of the children.

As with all assessments they are just one part of the information that teachers use to assist them in providing the best possible program of learning for each child.

Teachers assess in a variety of ways and the collection of data is an integral and ongoing process throughout the year.







Teachers use assessment for a variety of purposes, they:

- assess student learning
- provide feedback to students on their learning
- make consistent and comparable judgement
- interpret student data
- report on student achievement.

"High quality student assessment supports teachers to monitor student progress and inform next steps, determine the effectiveness of chosen teaching strategies – both for learning and engagement – and to measure student understanding of a unit of work (Stronge 2002)."

Thank you for your ongoing support in keeping all the members of our community safe.

RAT KITS will be coming home with your children today. Please continue to administer these on Monday's & Wednesday's as recommended.

### **COVID – 19 Symptoms and Testing**

Any student or staff member who is unwell with COVID-19 symptoms will be sent home and asked to get tested immediately and self-isolate until a negative result is received. Staff and students who receive a positive rapid antigen or PCR test result must let the office know as soon as possible, and follow NSW Health advice. Positive RAT results must be registered on the Service NSW Website or Service NSW App .

We will regularly communicate to parents about the presence and impact of COVID-19 in our community and will inform parents with details of any impacted year groups or cohorts.

If your child is in isolation for seven days because a member of the family has tested positive, the school is here to support your child's learning. You have access to the learning resources provided by Catholic Education, Diocese of Parramatta which is specific to each grade.

Children who have tested positive for Covid-19 are encouraged to rest and focus on their recovery.

### **DROP-OFF & PICK-UP OF STUDENTS**

As parents are unable to come onto school grounds, contactless drop off and pick up will continue for all children in Years K-6 until further notice. The procedures for this are outlined below.

### **Morning Drop Off for Students**

All parents and carers of students in Years K-6 are required to use the 'kiss and drop' zone which is set up in the parish car park for morning drop-off. Parents/carers must remain in their car at all times. Please note that there is no parking in the parish car park for morning drop off. If you wish to park and walk your child to the school gate, please park in McCulloch or Wood Street. Parents/carers who prefer to walk with their child/children to school are asked to use the front gate. This gate will be open for students to enter and will be supervised by a staff member. Parents/Carers are reminded that only students are to enter the school site. We also ask that Parents please not congregate in front of, or near the school.

### Afternoon Pick-up A - K families only - Front Gate 1

Parents / carers are asked to please park their vehicle in Woods Street and enter through the front gate. Parents / carers do not need to use the QR code on entry. 2. Parents / carers are to assemble in the staff carpark in the designated area to collect their child/children. Your family name card must be displayed.

### Afternoon Pick-up L - Z families only - Parish Car Park Gate 3

1. Parents/carers are to park their vehicle in the parish carpark and proceed to the collection area with their family name card. This area will be marked out with coloured witches hats. 2. Teachers on duty will call for your child to move to the exit gate to meet their parent/carer. This gate is situated nearer the church. Your family name card must be displayed. 3. Once your child/children have been collected parents/carers are to return to their vehicle and exit the carpark immediately. Please remember to use your family name card in order to make it easier for staff on duty to identify you.

### Kindergarten Afternoon Pick-up A-Z families - Parish Car Park Gate 3 until further notice.

We kindly ask that Parents/Carers do not congregate at the front of the school or in the Parish Carpark in the afternoons following pick up and that physical distancing (2 sqm distance) is maintained.
