A Message from the Principal

Dear Parents and Carers,

Last week we had our opening school mass where our school leaders for 2022 were acknowledged in front of their parents and their peers. At this mass I spoke to all of our stage Three children about the fact that, as the eldest members of our student community, they are all called upon to be leaders. A community is not made great by its leaders but rather by all members of the community working together to support each other.

At a recent meeting I was at with other leaders from the Catholic Education Office Diocese of Parramatta we were called upon to ensure that everyone who comes into our schools is made to feel "Welcome, Valued and Confident". On Friday at Mass I challenged our Stage Three students to think about how they can contribute to making sure everyone in our school feels "Welcome, Valued and Confident"

It is important to us as a staff that all of our children feel welcome, that they are happy and feel safe at school and that they know there are others who value them, and the contribution they make to their class. It is also important that we are able to build in them confidence in all aspects of their life. A Message from the Religious Education Coordinator

Ash Wednesday



Next Wednesday, 2nd MARCH, we mark the beginning of the Church's season of Lent by celebrating Ash Wednesday. We will be holding a Liturgy of the Word at school for the students where children of all ages may receive ashes. At this stage this will be a student only liturgy.

Throughout Lent, students are encouraged to acknowledge their shortcomings and make a special effort to turn back to God. As Fr Christopher Sarkis writes," Lent calls us into the secret place of the heart where we are alone with God, allowing us to examine our conscience and life in order to shine a light on whatever may be keeping us from being completely united with God."

Prayer - An important part of your child's spiritual growth is taking time for prayer. As we move into Lent, Catholics have traditionally focussed on fasting, alms giving and prayer as a means of turning back to God. Maybe this Lent your family could take time to pray.

Three simple steps to make prayer happen:

- 1. Create Time An opportune time to pray is when children are settling to sleep or you gather for a family meal.
- 2. What to say Invite your child/children to think over their day, the fun/good times, the people they met etc. Begin with the Sign of the Cross and then say, 'Let's thank God for the people we love.' (ask your child/children to name them.
- **3. Prayers** Use a variety of traditional prayers. Each newsletter during Lent we will publish a number of prayers that you might like to use.

Early Years Assessment

Over the coming weeks our Early Stage 1 and Stage 1 teachers will be completing the Early Years Assessment for all children. This literacy assessment, along with the Mathematics Assessment Interviews (MAIs), gives teachers valuable information to inform the planning of learning/teaching opportunities for children. It also helps to identify any needs that the children have which can then be targeted either in the classroom or in early intervention programmes. These literacy and numeracy assessment tools offer an opportunity for teachers to understand a child's beliefs, attitudes, strengths, thinking process and skills and help their teachers to learn about how their students think, and what they know.

School photography information: Online orders - do not require an envelope returned to your school.

Sibling Photos - Don't forget to pre-order your sibling photos online up to 24 hours before photo day. We provide your school with a list of sibling orders right up to the day of photography, so no one misses out. If you miss the online order deadline, you can submit a completed sibling order envelope first thing in the morning of the day of photography, so your school is aware you want the photo taken and can bring your children together in time for it. Sibling photographs only apply to children enrolled at your school.

Late fees - a late fee will be applied to each package purchased after photo day due to the additional cost of producing these packages separately

Package delivery - photographic packages will be returned to your school for distribution approximately six weeks after photos are taken.

COVID 19 Back to School Safety

A reminder that if your child tests positive to COVID-19, it's important to let the school know as soon as possible and to notify NSW Health through the Service NSW App. For safety, schools will also be monitoring students' health and asking families to collect students who display COVID-19 symptoms. If they display any symptoms they should take a Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) or a PCR test. If the test is negative but symptoms continue, your child MUST stay home and take another RAT or PCR test in 24 hours.

Please note that if there is a case of COVID-19 in your child's class, year or other grouping, your child can continue to attend school if they have no symptoms, in line with NSW Health advice.

What if someone at home has COVID-19? If there is a case of COVID-19 in your household, it's important that all family members follow the close contact rules and self-isolate for seven days. Please let the school know of the absence and when it is expected they will be able to return.

Nut Aware School

Our School is a Nut Aware School. At St John's Primary School, we have children and staff who have severe allergies to nuts. While allergic reactions are common and most are not serious, for these children the reaction can be life-threatening. This is called anaphylaxis and can occur in minutes of an exposure to a trigger, in these cases, nuts. We see prevention as a major part of providing a safe environment for these people. So as to support our community's effort in this regard, parents are requested not to send nuts or foods containing nuts to school with their children. The following list gives examples of such foods:- Peanuts, hazelnuts, almonds, cashews, macadamia nuts, peanut butter, nutella, biscuits and cakes containing nuts, snack packs containing nuts, chocolate bars containing nuts, eg Picnics, Mars Bars (almond), Nut Breaks and Fruit & Nut Chocolates, marzipan and nougat, muesli bars and snack bars containing nuts, yoghurt and nut mixer packs, some confectionery items, yoghurt muesli bars. We realise that there may be trace elements of nuts in a variety of other foods. However, if you use the above list as a guide you will be doing your part. Parents can also reinforce with their children that sharing food is not allowed at St John's. Thank you for working with us in partnership to support the safety of everyone in our community.

Complaints and Grievances

If, at any time, you find that you have a concern with the school, you are encouraged to come to the school and speak with the teacher/s, assistant principal and/or principal, to find a resolution for your concern.

It is our aim to work with all members of our school community to ensure that we do the very best we can to provide a productive, safe and enjoyable learning experience for our students and professionally fulfilling experience for our staff.

If you would like to raise a concern formally, the Catholic Education Office has procedures for ensuring that complaints are handled fairly.

Driving and parking safely in and around school

The beginning and end of the school day are busy times for pedestrians and vehicles outside the school. That's why you need to take extra care in 40km/h school zones.

- Park safely and legally, even if it means walking further to the school gate. Parking signs are planned with children's safety in mind.
- Slow down to 40km/h in the school zone and stay aware of crossings.
- Always park and turn legally around the school.
- Never double park as it puts children at risk.
- Manoeuvres such as U-turns and three-point turns are dangerous.
- Never park in a bus zone or in the school bus bay.
- Make sure your children use the Safety Door (rear footpath side door) to get in and out of the car.
- At a supervised crossing, observe the directions of the school crossing supervisor.
- Model safe and considerate behaviour for your child they will learn from you.

Remember to always give way to pedestrians particularly when entering and leaving driveways. Don't park across the school driveway or the entrance to the school car park. It's always a good idea to use the drop off and pick up area suggested by your school. This will help keep all children as safe as possible during the busiest times of the school day.
