Absent Explanation Reminder

CEDP promotes daily school attendance. Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education. If your child is sick or absent you are required to notify their school on the first day of absence if at all possible. All explanations to the school must be provided within **7 days** from the first day of any period of absence. Absences can be explained using one of the following methods:

- 1. SMS: respond with reason to school notification of absence
- 2. Online: log the absence directly using [Skool Bag App]
- 3. Email: the school at *riverstone@parra.catholic.edu.au*
- 4. Telephone: the school office 02 9854 3200

3. being required to attend a recognized religious holiday

4. exceptional or urgent family circumstances e.g. attending a funeral

5. Note sent with your child

Where an explanation has not been received within the 7 day timeframe or the explanation has not been accepted, the school will record the absence as unexplained or unjustified on the student's record. The school will not be able to accept explanations which are not received within the 7 day timeframe.

Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- 1. being sick or having an infectious disease
- 2. having an unavoidable medical appointment

Why do I need to notify the school if my child is absent?

Parents of children aged 6 to 17 years are legally required to ensure their children attend school every day or provide an explanation if they are absent. Notifying the school and providing an explanation for your child's absence will fulfill this legal responsibility.

The safety and wellbeing of students are the highest priorities for schools. Parents need to know if their child isn't at school, and schools need to know when and why a child is absent. Notifying the school of your child's absence helps ensure the safety and wellbeing of all children in school. every lea every da

What is your responsibility?

- Ensure your child attends school every day
- Notify the school immediately if your child is absent
- Provide an explanation for any absences within 7 days
- Make sure the school has your correct contact details so that you can receive attendance information about your child

Naplan Practice Test - Next week on Thursday 24th March students in Y3 and Y5 will be participating in a Naplan Practice test. The purpose of this test is to provide an opportunity for students to practice answering different types of questions online. It is a coordinated practice test occuring at the same time in all CEDP schools. There are no results from this practice test. Students will require their own headphones or earbuds. Supporting children to transition back to school

With the added disruptions that we have faced this term from COVID and school closures due to the risk of flooding it is important to support your child's return to school. The students and families have experienced many disruptions and changes to the usual school routine during the last two years. Kids Help Line has valuable resources for parents and children.

Here are some ways you can support your child:

- Get back into routine. Routines are safe and familiar which can help reduce anxiety.
- Focus on what you can control. It's hard getting caught up in the unknown and 'what-if's'? Helping your child identify what they can control and practical things they can do can help them be more in the present moment and reduce anxiety. Practical strategies can include getting organised, making plans for the weekend, preparing their school bag, etc.
- **Revisit good hygiene practices:** for example washing and /or hand sanitising. Reviewing this can help your child feel more at ease about their safety when at school.
- **Provide reassurance.** Sometimes we can't solve all our children's problems, but they don't always need solutions just to feel understood and supported.
- **Explore the positives.** Even if they are worried about returning to school, there may be some things they are looking forward to. It can be helpful to chat through these together if they seem open to this.
- **Contact your child's teacher**: If you feel that your child is worried or anxious about school please contact their teacher by ringing the School Office or sending an email to <u>riverstone@parra.catholic.edu.au</u>. Our aim is to work together to support your child.

COVID 19 Back to School Safety

A reminder that if your child tests positive to COVID-19, it's important to let the school know as soon as possible and to notify NSW Health through the Service NSW App. For safety, schools will also be monitoring students' health and asking families to collect students who display COVID-19 symptoms. If they display any symptoms they should take a Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) or a PCR test. If the test is negative but symptoms continue, your child MUST stay home and take another RAT or PCR test in 24 hours. Please note that if there is a case of COVID-19 in your child's class, year or other grouping, your child can continue to attend school if they have no symptoms, in line with NSW Health advice. **What if someone at home has COVID-19?** If there is a case of COVID-19 in your household, it's important that all family members follow the close contact rules and self-isolate for seven days. Please let the school know of the absence and when it is expected they will be able to return.

Driving and parking safely in and around school

The beginning and end of the school day are busy times for pedestrians and vehicles outside the school. That's why you need to take extra care in 40km/h school zones.

• Park safely and legally, even if it means walking further to the school gate. Parking signs are planned with children's safety in mind.

- Slow down to 40km/h in the school zone and stay aware of crossings.
- Always park and turn legally around the school.
- Never double park as it puts children at risk.
- Manoeuvres such as U-turns and three-point turns are dangerous.
- Never park in a bus zone or in the school bus bay.
- Make sure your children use the Safety Door (rear footpath side door) to get in and out of the car.
- At a supervised crossing, observe the directions of the school crossing supervisor.
- Model safe and considerate behaviour for your child they will learn from you.

Remember to always give way to pedestrians particularly when entering and leaving driveways. Don't park across the school driveway or the entrance to the school car park. It's always a good idea to use the drop off and pick up area suggested by your school. This will help keep all children as safe as possible during the busiest times of the school day.

Help Keep Kids Safe
