Dear St John's Families,

Last week I wrote to the Stage 3 parents to inform them that our Religious Education Coordinator and Stage Three Teacher, Mr Philip Margerison had resigned from his position at St Johns. I sincerely thank Mr Margerison for his faith leadership and his service to the St John's community as teacher and Religious Education Coordinator. On behalf of the community, I wish him every blessing in his retirement. He will, of course, remain firmly in our prayers during this very difficult time.

The process for the recruitment of a new Religious Education Coordinator will commence immediately.

**Voice Of Youth -** Congratulations to *Jyugaard* and *Shritik* who represented our school at the Voice of Youth cluster final at Santa Sophia on Monday this week.

Both boys prepared very engaging speeches and spoke well on the day. Unfortunately St John's didn't make it through to the next stage but we are still very proud of both our finalists. I was also so impressed with all of the Stage 3 students who attended the Voice of Youth Competition on the day. They gave all of the speakers their full attention and were a credit to our school.

Yesterday all families received a letter about our upcoming **Walk-a-Thon** to be held on **Friday 16 September**. This event will involve all students and will be our major fundraiser for the year. **While small events such as the Mother's Day stall and the Father's Day stall raise some money for the school they really just cover costs and are more about providing students with experiences and building community spirit. Each year we have a budget for maintenance of the school and often when these costs run high we have little left to put towards resources. This year we have replaced the air conditioning in Early Stage 1, installed new outdoor lighting for COSCH and replaced the projector in the hall - these were outside of already budgeted projections.** 

The money raised from the Walk-a-Thon will go towards the purchase of playground and classroom resources that will benefit all children across the school. We are hoping to purchase more technology (each chrome book costs \$500) and we would like to move the fresh water filter at the back of Stage 3 to the playground where it is accessible for all children to refill their drink bottles. Thank you in anticipation of your generous support in providing new resources for your children.

### **Attendance**



Throughout most of the first half of the year our overall attendance rate has been close to 90 percent and while this may sound high we are always aiming to have attendance rates above 95 percent - that is 95 percent of children at school 95 percent of the time.

We understand that we ask you to keep children at home if they are unwell and that children have had to isolate due to family illness. However, if children are well and can be at school then they should be at school. Please consider your reasons for keeping children at home. It is easy to fall into a pattern of non attendance when children are allowed to stay home regularly when they are not sick.

Every day missed makes it harder for children to catch up and can lead to gaps in learning and social connections. Two days off a term adds up to four weeks a year, which over the course of schooling from Kindergarten to Year 12 adds up to a full year missed.

#### **Consent for Photos and Videos**

A reminder to Parents and Carers that upon enrolment and at the commencement of each year, consent to have school photos / video etc is given. If at anytime you wish to withdraw this consent Parents and Carers must contact the school in writing.

### **Work Health and Safety Reminders**

#### COVID 19 Back to School Safety

• A reminder to all that the COVID-smart settings that students, staff and communities have become used to will continue in Term 3.

#### These include:

- Staying home if unwell or showing any symptoms, and not returning to school or work until fully recovered
- Household and close contacts are required to follow the NSW Health household and close contact guidelines
  for 7 days from the last time someone in their household tested positive to COVID-19. In line with the updated
  rules for the general community, teachers and students who are household contacts, but do not have any
  COVID-19 symptoms, can return to school, however, we ask that you please inform us if your child is a
  household contact. In such circumstances, staff and students over the age if 12 must wear a mask. (Mask
  wearing is recommended for primary students but not mandatory)
- Rapid antigen testing for any students or staff showing symptoms and for household and close contacts who are able to return to school
- Maximising natural ventilation including utilising air purifiers (including scheduled replacement of filters)
- Good hygiene practices for students and staff including regular hand washing with soap and water
- Encouraging all students, staff and families to keep up to date with vaccinations, including COVID-19 booster shots when eligible and the flu vaccine

#### n addition to this:

- We strongly encourage all staff and school visitors to wear a mask while indoors, particularly during the next four weeks.
- All families were distributed with Rapid Antigen Test Kits at the end of Term 2. Please use these as necessary and contact the school if you require more.

f our school were to experience high numbers of COVID-19 cases we will consider postponing non-essential large group activities where it is feasible to do so.
