# A message from the Assistant Principal

## **NAPLAN 2023**

The National Assessment Program- Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is a point in time assessment of literacy and numeracy skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life.

Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in the annual tests in writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. Year 3 complete the writing assessment on paper- all the other assessments are completed via a secure online platform.

NAPLAN Online will take place in term 1 next year between the **15th - 27th March 2023**.

If you would like your child to have some practice answering the type of questions you can encourage them to use the <u>public demonstration site</u> to familiarise themselves with the types of questions and tools available in the NAPLAN online tests. The class teachers will also be using this site next year to ensure that students have the technological skills required to complete the assessments.

# A message from the Religious Education Coordinator



"People were walking in the dark when they saw a bright light. A light came to them to brighten their darkland. You have made them very happy. They will be never sad again. A child is born. A son given to us. He will be wonderful. His name will be Prince of Peace. He will tell us what to do and we will find peace."

These words were written by the Prophet Isaiah. As we prepare to celebrate another Christmas, we recall the birth of Jesus long ago at Bethlehem and we rejoice in his continuing presence amongst us today. Christmas preparations indicate that we are in the closing month of the year, the closing weeks of the academic school year and more significantly for some students, the end of their time as students at this school.

For people surrounded by department store decorations, commercials, Christmas carols, special foods, and the like, believing that today's Christmas celebration actually evolved from the humble story of a young woman giving birth in the straw is a stretch. It might help to focus on the characters involved.

What do you think went through Joseph's mind as he witnessed Mary giving birth to a baby? What do you think went through Mary's mind as she struggled with the birth experience?



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The Christmas story is full of symbols. Jesus, who becomes our bread and wine – our nourishment – is laid in a manger, the feeding trough for the animals. Jesus, who is the champion of poor people, is born into a homeless family. Poor shepherds were the first to welcome the Messiah that the Jewish people had been awaiting for generations. The symbol of angels singing, praising God, and flying madly all over the sky was a good clue that something out of the ordinary was happening.

Modern Christmas stories use different symbols to make the same points: Rudolph, the 'poorest' reindeer, becomes the champion; and Frosty, a snowman, transforms children's lives.

# Work Health and Safety Reminders

# Covid - Changes to self-isolation requirements

On 30 September, National Cabinet announced that from Friday 14 October 2022 people who test positive for COVID-19 do not need to self-isolate. In line with this announcement, the NSW Department of Education has worked with NSW Health to support all schools to adapt to this change while continuing to prioritise student and staff wellbeing by minimising the risk of COVID-19 transmissions.

It is recommended that staff and students continue to stay home if they are sick. We will continue to call parents to collect their child if they are displaying cold or flu like symptoms.

Anyone who believes they have been exposed to COVID-19 is recommended to monitor for symptoms, test, and wear a mask if they are concerned. If you test positive on a rapid antigen test (RAT) please<u>register</u> this with Service NSW (note that such registration is now voluntary). Voluntarily registering your result can help you access medical support from NSW Health, including antiviral medicines if you are eligible. It also assists NSW Health to respond to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic.

### Continued COVID-smart measures

At St John's we will continue to operate with the 'baseline' COVID-smart measures in place throughout Term 4 to minimise transmission and to prioritise student and staff wellbeing. This includes a combination of layered safety measures – we continue to encourage mask-wearing along with the use of rapid antigen testing (RAT), good ventilation in indoor settings as well as extra cleaning of high touch surfaces..

Visitors attending the school continue to be encouraged to wear a mask, particularly when indoors and/or when physical distancing is not possible.
