# A message from the Principal

Dear St John's Families,

In the last newsletter I announced that I would be on leave from this week until the end of the term. Unfortunately this week my father in law passed away after a long illness and we have decided to postpone our holiday. I will now be at school until the end of the term.

In week 10 this term our Semester One reports will be available via the COMPASS portal. Schools are required to report on student achievement in Key Learning Areas (subjects), such as English, Mathematics and Religion against a 5 point scale. All children in Years 1-6 will have their achievement shown based on this five point common grade scale. For the children in Year 1 this will be the first time they receive this formal report, as schools are not required to use the five point scale for Kindergarten children. The following provides a descriptor for each grade on the common grade scale according to NESA (NSW Education Standards Authority).

Extensive	The student has an <b>extensive</b> knowledge and understanding of the content and can readily apply this knowledge. In addition, the student has achieved a very high level of competence in the processes and skills and can apply these skills to new situations.
Thorough	The student has <b>thorough</b> knowledge and understanding of the content and a high level of competence in the processes and skills. In addition, the student is able to apply this knowledge and these skills to most situations.
Sound	The student has a <b>sound</b> knowledge and understanding of the main areas of content and has achieved an adequate level of competence in the processes and skills.
Basic	The student has a <b>basic</b> knowledge and understanding of the content and has achieved a limited level of competence in the processes and skills
Elementary	The student has an <b>elementary</b> knowledge and understanding in few areas of the content and has achieved very limited competence in some of the processes and skills.

A **sound** achievement indicates that your child has learnt the content and skills required to demonstrate proficiency of this particular syllabus outcome at **this point in time**. They have sound knowledge, skills and understanding which is an achievement they can be very proud of.

This week all parents were sent an invitation to book an appointment on the School Interviews website to meet early next term with your child's teacher. This is a valuable time to discuss your child's learning and to set some learning goals for the second half of the year. I encourage all parents/carers to take advantage of this opportunity.

Every child has individual strengths and these should be celebrated. Equally important, every child has areas of challenges and these challenges should be embraced as opportunities to grow and learn. As a school we are committed to work with parents and carers to provide a rich, holistic, quality Catholic education. Our Learning Reports are part of your child's educational story and learning journey at St John's.

This week we celebrate the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. In the Sacred Heart, we see that God's heart is consumed with love for us—so much so that he was willing to suffer and die for us. The Sacred Heart teaches us that true love, while sometimes difficult, is life giving. Hence why we often focus on those less fortunate than ourselves during this Feast Day.

O most holy Heart of Jesus, fountain of every blessing, I adore you, and I love you.

I offer you this poor heart of mine. Make me humble, patient, pure,
and wholly obedient to your will. Grant, good Jesus, that I may live in you and for you.

#### **Fun Maths Game**

The NSW Government Education website has some great ideas for maths games students and families can do. This idea is for any grade with a range of possible numbers to use.

### Mind reading magic?

Magicians are often mathematicians who wear fancy capes.

There are plenty of fun tricks you and your child can work on to amaze your family and friends. Try this one out with your child before using it to surprise and amaze a larger audience.

#### The Challenge

- 1. Ask your child to think of a number, any number.
- 2. Then ask them to double it.
- 3. Now add 10.
- 4. Halve it.
- 5. Take away the original number.
- 6. Now tell them that you're going to read their mind using all of your amazing magical powers. Tell them you know the number that they're now thinking of is... 5!





#### The Conversation

Many magic tricks are rich in mathematics. After amazing your child with this trick, explore the number magic further by:

- working with your child to do this trick with a few different numbers. The answer is always 5.
- asking your child to figure out how and why this trick works
- creating your own trick that leads to a different solution.

Save the Date: On Tuesday 8 August we will be holding a Mathematics night at school for all parents and carers. More information about this will come out early next term.

Where am I going in my learning?


Where am I now?

The process of identifying students' current progress and aligning teachers' actions is fluid and requires continual monitoring of learning and adjusting instruction.

#### Culture

To enable all students to have a voice and choice in their learning and support others in their learning, teachers focus on the following questions: How do I improve my learning and that of others?

- Establish agreements and protocols that focus all students on learning
- Provide tools for students to determine their level of progress and proficiency
- Create the conditions for students to engage with failure in their learning
- Establish processes for students to offer, receive and use feedback to improve learning

# WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING IN STAGE THREE

In Stage 3, students have been engaging in various mathematics topics to expand their understanding and problem-solving skills.

One key area of focus has been 2D and 3D space, where students explore shapes, angles, and spatial relationships. Students have enjoyed learning about shapes and objects. Towards the end of the term students will construct a 3-Dimensional artwork using our new Splats! which assists children to draw 3D objects. Another topic covered this term is volume and capacity, where students investigate the measurement of liquids and solids, including conversions between different units.

Additionally, Year 6 have begun exploring patterns and algebra, where they have analysed number sequences, identified rules, and solved equations.

Parents can actively engage their children by asking questions like:

- Can you find the capacity of \_\_\_\_\_? (juice container, milk jug)
  - How would you measure the volume of a box?
- Can you identify the pattern in this number sequence and predict the next number?"
  - Can you write an equation to solve this problem?

These questions foster critical thinking and reinforce the mathematical concepts learned in Stage 3.



Lunch orders can be placed via the Spriggy Schools App on Mondays and Fridays

If for any reason it is past the cut-off time, caregivers can contact Sam on 02 9627 1634 and if there is reasonable time to prep the order, Sam can place the order for the student via the back end of the Spriggy Schools app. Sam will be requesting sufficient details to ensure the correct student account is being charged. Caregivers can request a refund and cancel the order via the app prior to 9am, if it is past 9am, the caregiver must contact Sam and if the order hasn't been made, Sam will issue a refund back onto the students account.
